The Gift of Thanksgiving...

Are you counting on the perfect Thanksgiving this year? Unless you and your loved ones live in some magic bubble, 'tain't going to happen. For some, the family circle won't be complete this year. Or perhaps illness or financial problems make it hard to feel thankful. But then, the story we usually read for Thanksgiving is a model of gratitude in difficult circumstances. Look up Luke 17:11-19 and read again the story of the ten lepers.

I really noticed this story when given an assignment to write a make-believe Thanksgiving sermon in the

aftermath of a tragedy that damaged the church, destroyed homes, and landed church members in the hospital. For all our wishing that we could see Jesus face to face, the first thing I noticed was that the lepers couldn't look in Jesus' face, either. Keeping their lepers' distance, they called "from afar," asking for mercy. They were physically as distant from him as we sometimes feel emotionally in times of crisis.

And this time Jesus didn't draw near and place his hands on them. "Go and show yourselves to the priests," he told them. This was the usual rite when a

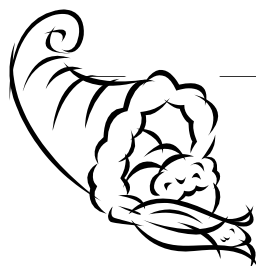
leper hoped to be pronounced free of the disease. It wasn't so much a healing ritual as an examination and approval to return to the community from isolation. It's hard to imagine that these lepers hadn't gone hopefully to the priest before, maybe many times. Depressed and discouraged as they must have been—and now disappointed that Jesus didn't quickly heal them—the lepers refused to let their circumstances crush out their hope. They did as Jesus bade them, *regardless of how they may have felt.*

As they went, they were cleansed. *As they went.* So at first there seemed not to be anything to be thankful for at all. The lepers only realized they were healed as they stepped out on faith. And seemingly no healing would have happened had they not trusted and obeyed as best they could. Maybe in whatever you're dealing with this holiday season, there are tentative, shaky steps you can take. Maybe that amounts to simply refusing to be defeated by a . . . The story has a happy ending, with the ten lepers being healed. Physical healing is sometimes the way that God blesses us. At other times God's gifts of serenity, love, neighbor, and inner strength support us through troubles. Paul teaches that in Christ, somehow the answer is always yes.

The sad part of this story is that nine of the lepers never did look Jesus in the face. The only close communion with Jesus comes when the tenth leper offers his thanks. I don't want to be among those nine who missed out.

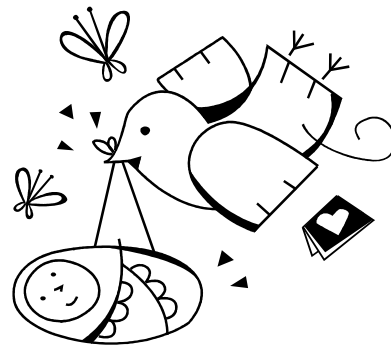

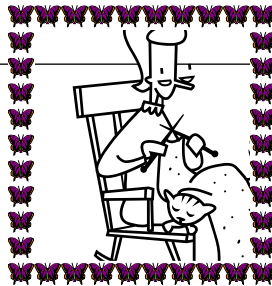
A Stitch in Time – Knit and Crochet Group

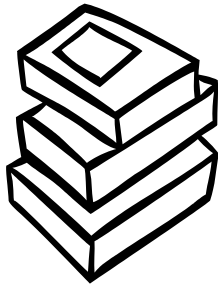

Statistics show that 1 out of every 6 Americans now live in poverty, or 46 million Americans. Households with annual earnings of less than \$22,314 for a family of four are considered to be in poverty. The poverty rate for children younger than 18 increased from 20.7 percent the previous year to 22 percent. Emergency Feeding Program has recently been notified that some federal funding they had been receiving has been discontinued, making it even more difficult for them to feed the homeless and hungry.

Chuck Pietka notified me that our EFP funds have reached a very low level once again, and I have to notify all you faithful supporters that we really need your financial help now. Based on the information in the first paragraph, this would be a very bad time for Holy Trinity to cut down on the bags we donate. HTLC Council Meeting Highlights October 11, 2011

Holy Trinity Lutheran Church Council Meeting Highlights October 11, 2011

President Tim Parker opened the meeting at 7:00 PM; a quorum was present, devotions and approval of minutes followed.

Pastors' Reports:

Pastor Sue Wanwig continues to visit members and added a few more to her list.

Pastor Deanna Wildermuth is working with the confirmands this month before their confirmation on Reformation Sunday. She is attending a conference in Washington DC October 15th-20th on "Leading Age," representing the board of the Hearthstone. Commitment Sunday is coming up.

Financial Report: Tom Elzey, representing Finance, reported we expect to be \$10,000 ahead of budget revenues and \$30,000 under budget expenses for calendar year 2011, or \$40,000 ahead in net income for the year. This means we will roll forward \$40,000 of the new pastor fund to 2012, using just \$15,000 of the funds in 2011.

Planning Task Force Report: Pastor

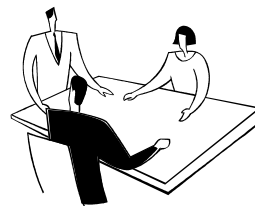
Wildermuth presented the Planning Task Force Report to the Council. The report includes a number of recommendations for HTLC. It will be up to the Council to move the recommendations forward for discussion and implementation. The findings will be shared with the congregation, likely through upcoming Adult Forums or similar events, although the detailed report will not be distributed to the congregation at this time. A motion was made to accept the report as presented. The motion was seconded and passed without dissent.

Committee Updates:

Lynn Tuttle, Congregational Life, reminded all of Operatoberfest on October 15th and requested donations for the reception.

Laurie Sperber, Youth, stated the Youth/Social Concerns auction raised approximately \$16,000.

Adjournment: After closing prayer, the meeting was adjourned at approximately 8:16 PM.

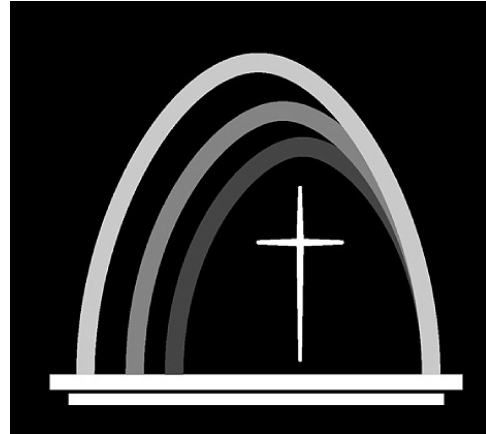

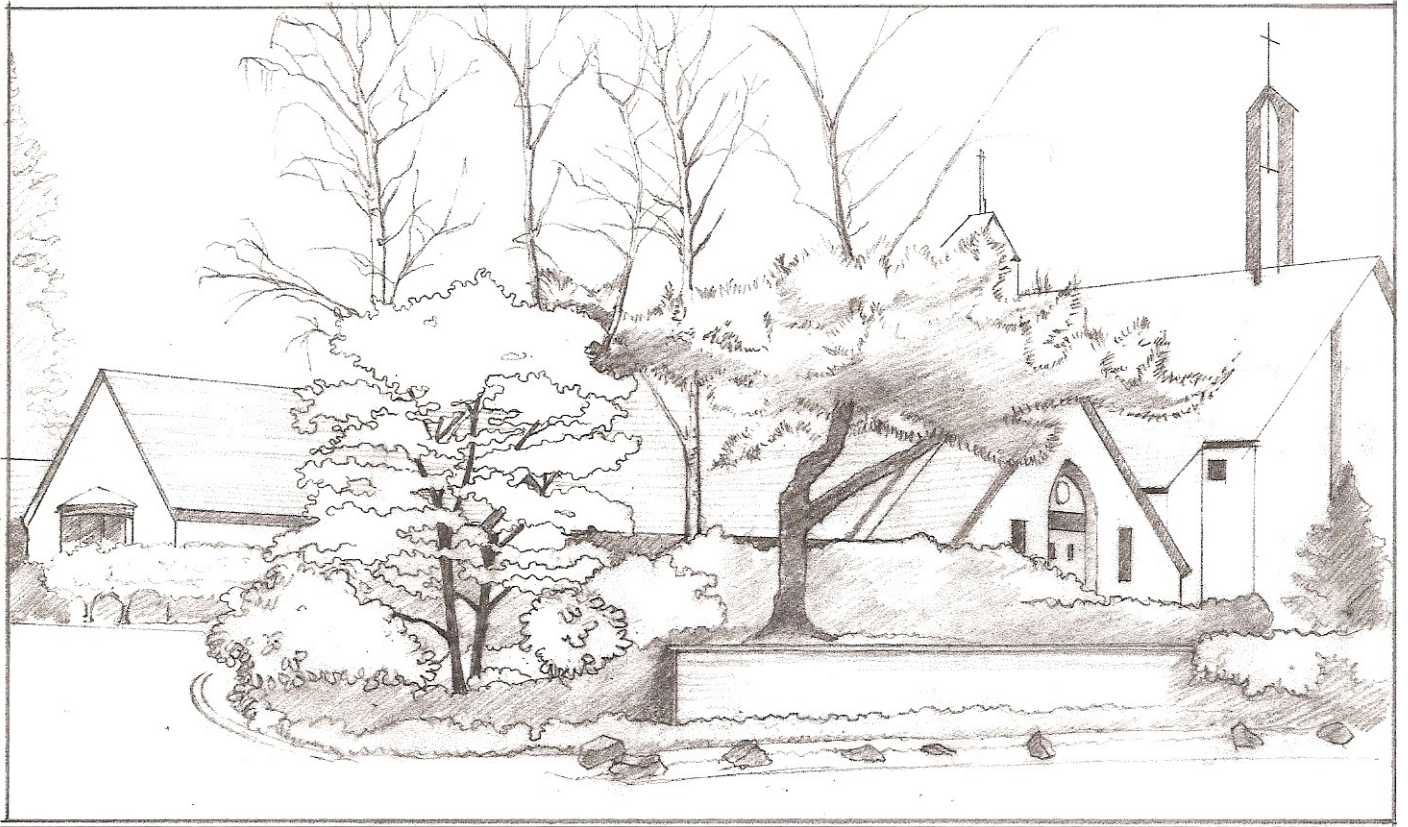
